HOW TO FIND YOUR BEST FIT

Jay Kessler once described the typical church as a football game: Thousands of people are sitting in the stands, watching, while 22 other guys are knocking their brains out on the field.

But that is not the picture of the Church that is revealed in the Bible. When Christians gather they represent Christ's *Body*. Whatever Jesus does on earth, He does through our hands, our voices and our feet.

Furthermore, *every* Christian is a valued member of the Body. This is clear from four key New Testament texts:

I Corinthians 12-14	Romans 12:1-8
Ephesians 4:1-16	I Peter 4:8-11

Your specific role in the Body – where you <u>*fit*</u> so well that each opportunity to serve leaves you completely energized and wanting more -- is determined in part by the *spiritual gifts* that God has uniquely provided you.

What are spiritual gifts? They may sound mystical or esoteric, but in reality may be known and grasped by any of God's people. Spiritual gifts are:

- *i.* Special abilities to minister to others
- *ii.* Given to every Christian (one gift or more)
- *iii.* Given by the Holy Spirit, as God chooses
- *iv.* Typically related to interests and yearnings that have long been part of your life, even before becoming a Christian
- v. Designed for use in the Body of Christ, not for personal fulfillment
- That means that: Every member of the Body is **different** Every member of the Body is **important** Every member must **do** its part **Nobody** has **all** the gifts of the Spirit

There is often a correlation between a person's past experiences, inside and outside the Church, and the gifts or special abilities that have been granted him or her by God. The following exercise is designed to help you explore what has been most satisfying or fulfilling in your relationships with God and with others, and should provide some clues as to what gifts you are most likely to exhibit now and in the future.

Place the number that is most appropriate beside all 140 statements:

- 2 Often true for me
- 1 True every once in a while for me
- 0 Never true for me

Be as honest as you can! Don't answer according to what you *wish* were true in your life, or what you *expect* to do someday. Your gifts should be detectable based on experiences you have already had.
